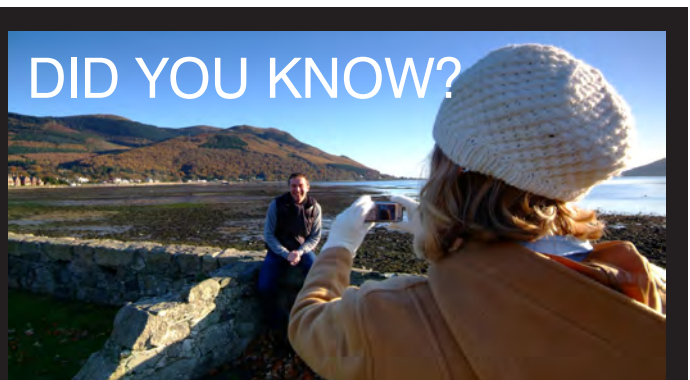

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## DID YOU KNOW?

Carlingford Lough (literally translated as "City of the Pool") is a sea loch that forms part of the border between North and South. It is fed by the Newry River and the Newry Canal. On the northern side, in County Down, are the coastal towns of Warrenpoint and Rostrevor, backed by the Mourne Mountains, and on the southern side are Omeath, Carlingford and Greenore, all on the Cooley peninsula in County Louth.
